Life Moves

LifeMoves Safe Parking for Families Program is an innovative solution to homelessness. LifeMoves provides a safe location for families living in their cars to stay overnight while receiving services from LifeMoves case managers. At the Seven Trees Community Center in San Jose, families with children can stay from 7:00 pm - 7:00 am in a secure, well-lit parking lot. In addition to safety, security and case management, the families provide encouragement to each other as they make their way back to stable housing.

Since the November 2018 start of the program, there have been over 20 families served and every exit from the program has been to a shelter or to stable housing.

On another subject, it was interesting to note that homeless individuals find their way on BART to SFO to seek a quiet place to sleep. When airport police locate them, they are referred to LifeMoves.

Doctors Without Borders (Medecins Sans Frontieres, or MSF)

For those of you who missed our excellent meeting on June 27, here is a brief synopsis of the interesting, informative talk about MSF by our charming guest speaker.

Farrah Kashfipour is a critical care nurse and humanitarian worker whose most recent assignment was in Bangladesh where she worked with Rohingya refugees as an outreach nurse.

MSF/Doctors Without Borders is a neutral organization that is fully funded by private donations. They accept no government sponsorship. They treat everyone regardless of race, religion, nationality or political association. DWB goes into places where the conditions are the worst. They don't duplicate services. If another organization is there, they choose an alternative location where there is great need. Their emphasis in on vaccination, sanitation, mental health support and whatever else is needed including surgery and medications.

We are excited that WWI has chosen this worthy cause as our international charity.

BOOKS TO READ - please recommend books that you have enjoyed that you can share

Back in the mid-1800s, women were not supposed to travel on their own, let alone to foreign countries. But Isabella Lucy Bird broke the mold. She left her native England to travel to "improve her health". If you count climbing the highest volcano in Hawaii and descending into the caldera until her face skin blistered, or riding through the Colorado Rockies in winter on her horse, wearing the riding dress that was made for her in Honolulu, as being good for your health, you may wonder what else she got up to.

These books are a collection of letters Isabella wrote back to her sister in Scotland. She literally circled the world - by boat and ship, of course - and then back again. She crossed Japan, being the first foreigner - let alone a woman - to pierce that secretive nation.

I suspect she'd have applied to Pan Am, had she lived in the 1950s instead of the 1850s.

So be sure to find these books. Order them at your library, or buy them on Amazon or Kindle. Just Google "Isabella Bird" and see which books might interest you. I find it fascinating to read about the places we flew to, from a Victorian woman's perspective.


