Here's my story:



Louise Diracles was a Pan Am stewardess from 1967-1973. She flew R & R's in and out of Saigon, Cameron Bay, and Da Nang in Vietnam. She would always ask to sit in the cockpit on landing which was frequently at night. She could see mortars going off like fireworks. It was a frightening time; Pan Am planes often had bullet holes in them; you had to volunteer for these flights; all Pan Am stewardesses got prisoner of war cards in case we were captured. Stewardesses flew the military to their two-week R & R vacations in places like Australia, Hawaii, Guam etc. It was so much fun going out of Vietnam; it was always a party. The guys were the BEST passengers ever. We'd get on the loud speaker and say, "Boys, it would really help us if you could crush your milk cartons so we could stow the trays more easily." You should have heard the bang, bang of those milk cartons being smashed!

Now, on the return trips back into Vietnam, the mood was somber.

One soldier gave Louise his stuffed koala bear. She tried to refuse; he said it would just get moldy in his locker. She treasures that gift and wonders if that soldier made it back to the USA.

Although Louise Diracles didn't participate in the evacuation after the fall of Saigon, her colleagues commented about it: there were people holding up their babies over the fence begging the stewardesses to take their babies on the plane; there were many more than the plane's capacity; babies were put in the overhead compartments for take-off and landing; babies were strapped to the stewardesses; the local money (piasters) were collected in a pillow case and given to the men with machine guns on the tarmac who then let more people on the plane; it was the most terrifying and yet most gratifying time.
