Doctors Without Borders/ MSF

August 19 was World Humanitarian Day. It provides the opportunity to come together and acknowledge the hard work of people helping people. That includes nearly 63,000 DWB staff in more than 70 countries around the world. Every day teams overcome seemingly insurmountable odds to ensure lifesaving care for people facing incredibly challenging circumstances.

Here is a quick picture of the impact DWB made in 2022:

- *16 million outpatient consultations
- *1.4 million emergency room admissions
- *4 million measles vaccinations
- *425,000 mental health consultations

Our donations are making an impact!

Dengue fever rates are historically high in Honduras. Traditional methods of attack and prevention are no longer effective in stopping the spread. DWB is using an innovative method of prevention by releasing mosquitoes that carry a type of bacterium that prevents transmission of viruses in hopes of stopping that spread.

LifeMoves

The newly opened Redwood City Navigation Center is up and running, with interim housing and supportive services:

- *240 rooms to serve 270 people per night
- *Commercial training kitchen serving the residents
- *On-site counseling & vocational training serving about 720 people per year
- *It covers 2.5 acres
